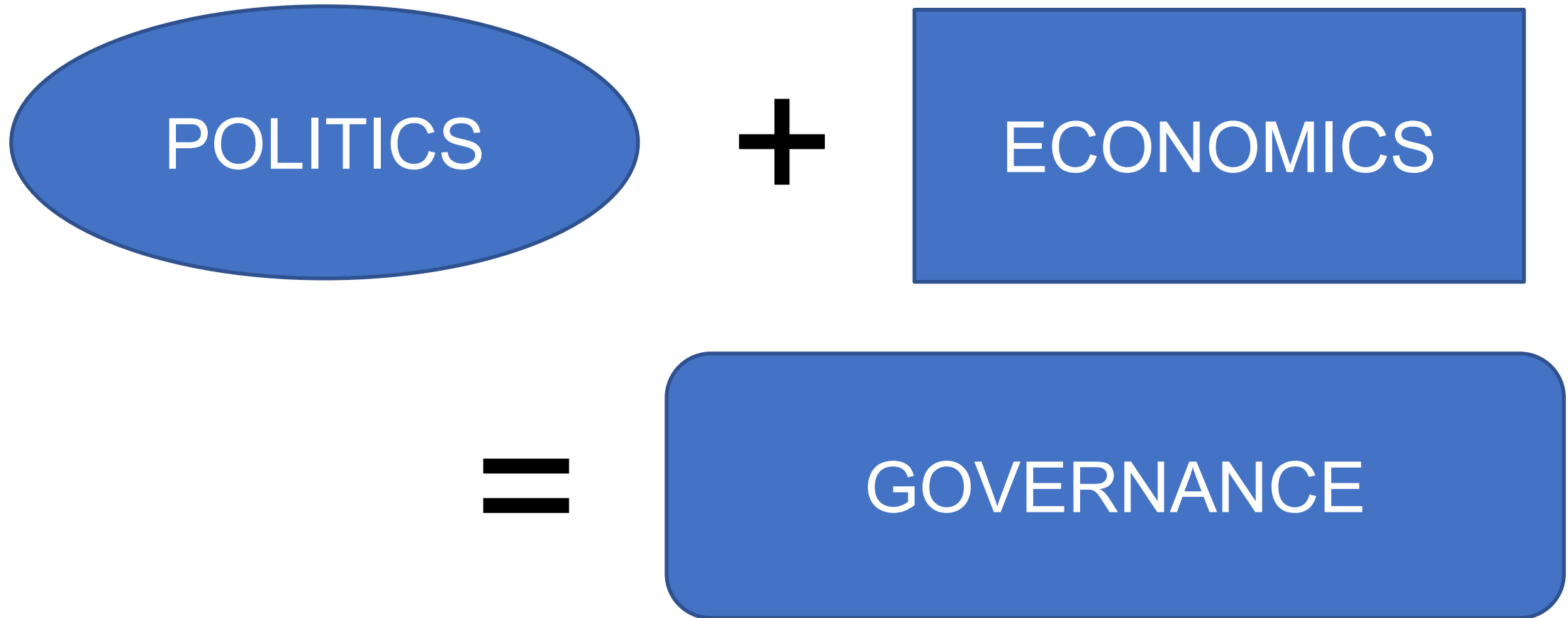

Demonstrates Estonia's and Finland's commitment to **public governance reform**, and commitment to **exploring governance solutions together, building on shared challenges.**

Philippine Development Plan 2023-2028: 'Practice Good Governance and Improve Bureaucratic Efficiency':

Higher rates of civil society organizations (CSO) participation were facilitated by the Fiscal Openness Program of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), the Support for Local Governance Program of the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), and the commitments made under the Philippine Open Government Partnership (PH-OGP)



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In 2022, total unused appropriations reached **P247.9 billion**, which is 6.9 percent of total available appropriations for the year.

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Province of Iloilo

- **Zero open defecation status in 2022 is vying for the Galing Pook Award for 2023**, which is conferred on the Best Local Governance Programs in the country.
- **Barangay Bariga, in the municipality of Banate**, was the first village out of the province's 1,721 barangays to achieve a ZOD status in 2015.
- Iloilo province was conferred with the ZOD Grade 1 status on Nov. 18, 2022.
- The province provided an **annual budget of PHP5 million to purchase toilet bowls, cement, and pipes given to target recipients whose counterpart is the labor component.**

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 29

STRENGTHENING THE INTEGRATION OF PUBLIC FINANCIAL
MANAGEMENT INFORMATION SYSTEMS, STREAMLINING
PROCESSES THEREOF, AND AMENDING EXECUTIVE ORDER NO.
55 (S. 2011) FOR THE PURPOSE

WHEREAS, Section 28, Article II of the Constitution declares it a policy of the State to adopt and implement full public disclosure of all its transactions involving public interest;

WHEREAS, Section 7, Article III of the Constitution provides that the right of the people to information on matters of public concern shall be recognized;

WHEREAS, under Section 2 of Republic Act No. 11032 or the "Ease of Doing Business and Efficient Government Service Delivery Act of 2018," the State shall promote integrity, accountability, and proper management of public affairs and public property, and establish effective practices to ensure efficient turnaround of delivery of government services and prevention of graft and corruption by mandating national government agencies (NGAs) to reengineer systems and procedures;

Executive Order No. 29

- Enjoins all local government units (LGUs) to adopt and implement an IFMIS in their transactions.

- Full adoption of IFMIS would ensure:
 - a) **strict compliance** with existing appropriations laws, rules and regulations;
 - b) **improve treasury cash management;**
 - c) **facilitate the generation of financial reports;**
 - d) **and ease reportorial requirements for the various levels of government.**
